- Parent Academy Workshops to share information with parents on attendance policies, homework tips and more.

- Use MCCS standards and math vocabulary when solving problems during homework assignments with family.
- Review the MCCS each night using online resources such as GIZMOS and USA Test Prep.
 Online resources must be coupled with classroom notes
- Attend workshops with their family to increase their academic performance levels.

- Set aside one night per week to apply the standards to real world situations outside of homework and classwork. (i.e. finances, banking, etc.)
