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What is Title I?

Morrow Middle School is identified as a Title I school as part of Every Student Succeeds Act 2015 (ESSA). School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Morrow Middle School will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement to support student learning. Morrow Middle values the contributions and involvement of parents to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. How is it revised?

Morrow Middle School will invite all parents to attend our annual revision meetings in the spring to review and revise this parental involvement policy, as well as the schoolwide plan, our school-parent compact and the parental involvement budget. Additionally, revision forms will be sent home with students to ensure that ALL parents are given the opportunity to provide their input. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. Parents will also have the opportunity to give feedback during parent meetings and activities during the school year including our Annual Title I Parent Meetings, monthly parent meetings, and schoolwide family events.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Morrow Middle School will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, families in transition, parents with disabilities and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available?

Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center and Front Office of Morrow Middle School. As a reminder, we will also mail a copy of the plan to all parents. The plan will also be posted on the school Web site.

2018 – 2019 District Goals

- By 2023, Clayton County Public Schools will increase the percentage of students scoring at the Proficient and/or Distinguished levels on the Georgia Milestones to at least 80% in each content area.

2018 – 2019 School Goals

- ✓ ELA: All students will show 17% increase by spring 2019.
- ✓ Math: 6th & 8th grade students will show 19% increase and 7th grade will show 17% increase by spring 2019.

School-Parent Compacts

Meet your child's teachers, our friendly and helpful staff and learn more about our curriculum and more.

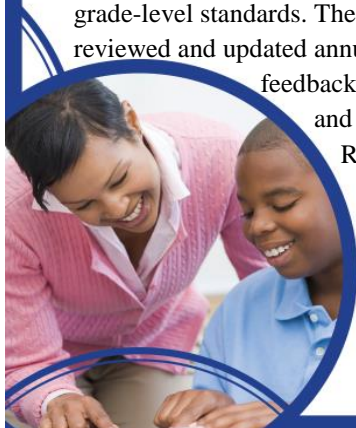
International Walk to School Day - October 18, 2018
